LOGISTICS FOR ADVOCACY DAY, MARCH 18

We are looking forward to seeing you in Trenton on March 18! Here are some logistics details that will hopefully answer questions you may have.

DIRECTIONS AND PARKING

We will be at the Masonic Temple, in the Stokes Library room, at 100 Barrack Street Trenton. While the main entrance is on Barrack, you may be directed to the E Front Street entrance due to construction. Either has easy access to our room. We'll have signs and greeters. There is a ramp at E Front Street so use that if handicap access is needed.

All our activities and restrooms are on the first floor.

We recommend that you use the garage at the statehouse; parking there is free, you will first stop at a guardhouse and tell why you're there, then at the garage you will need to show your driver's license, again tell why you're there, and you'll be directed which area to park in. It's an easy walk to the Masonic Temple from the garage. If you have difficulty walking we recommend you get dropped off; if you need help getting your car parked let us know. The link shows several lots close by, each a couple of blocks' walk.

ABOUT OUR APPOINTMENTS

As most legislators do not have offices in Trenton, we invite them to come to us to meet. As legislators come to meet with constituents, we will set up to talk in the hallway outside the room, where there is plenty of space even for multiple conversations. In some cases we may ask you to meet your legislator at the statehouse, likely in the cafeteria there. We will give you notice if this will be asked of you.

Our team is working diligently to arrange appointments with all participants' legislators, but not all legislators will be in Trenton that day, so you will likely not meet with all of your representatives, We are anticipating that most will have one or two meetings. We have a full slate of speakers to learn from as well, and will also discuss follow-up with indistrict meetings.
